

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PREFACE

The Statistical Abstract of Belize, is an annual publication and presents official statistics and other information on Belize. This statistical publication provides current figures about almost all aspect of the Belizean society. It is an invaluable source of information about a great many subjects: population, health, education, unemployment, agriculture, inflation, environment, trade etc. and many new topics.

The Central Statistical Office records its appreciation to the many Governmental Ministries, Departments, and other Organization and those persons who very graciously made available some of the information published here. CSO, also adopts this medium to express its appreciation for the great effort by all persons involved in the preparation and production of this report and in particular to the staff of the Data Collection and Processing Unit, who have contributed significantly to the production of this yearly publication.

Suggestion and comments for improving coverage and presentation of data should be sent to the Chief Statistician, at the above address.

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Section I

POPULATION and HOUSING

This section presents statistics on the size, distribution, structure and change of the population, as well as the housing characteristics of Belize. Additional characteristics such as ethnicity, religion, disability, country of birth (including the foreign born), education attainment, and marital and union status are also included. The main source of these data is the Central Statistical Office (CSO), which conducts a decennial “National Population and Housing Census”.

The Census attempts to have a complete population count. That is, an attempt is made to account for the selected characteristics (age, sex, residence, etc.) of every person that comprises the non-institutional population. Population figures for the Censuses in 1921, 1931, 1946, 1960, 1970, 1980, 1991 and 2000 are presented. Most tables include figures for only the most recent Censuses, the 1991 and 2000 Censuses, thus allowing for comparison between the two periods (Census day for these last two Censuses is the 12 of May).

Mid-year population estimates and other annual demographic estimates are usually based on administrative data (for example, vital statistics from the Registrar General’s Office) and data collected on surveys, such as the annual Labour Force Survey. Population estimates disaggregated at various levels, are not available from mid-year estimates and can only be obtained every ten years from the Population and Housing Censuses.

Enumerated and Tabulable

Census Population: The enumerated census population is all persons counted in the census. The tabulable census population include all persons who answered the census questionnaire. The adjusted population is the enumerated census population multiplied by an under coverage rate. Under coverage in the 1991 and 2000 Censuses were 1.8% and 3.5%, respectively. Tabulable census data presented in this report have not been adjusted for under-enumeration. Only the enumerated population at Census dates are adjusted figures.





Population by Ethnicity: 1991





Chart 1.4

Section II

VITAL STATISTICS

Civil registration and vital statistics systems exist in almost every country of the world. Typically, there is a direct relationship between the civil registration process and production of vital statistics. However, in Belize the registration system is dedicated to the more limited, although important, purpose of issuing proof to individuals of the events of a birth, death or marriage.

Official records of births and deaths have important legal and administrative uses for both governmental and individual purposes. For the individual, births provide legal documentation of identity and civil status. Death records provide legal evidence of the fact and circumstances of death and the demographic characteristics of the decedent for the purpose of inheritance of property, for claiming insurance or death benefits and for the support of claims for other benefits which may be predicated on the death of an individual.

Vital records, in the aggregate, provide the basis for vital statistics, which in turn provide key

demographic and health information about the population in Belize. Birth and death statistics are essential for making population estimates for intercensal years, as well as for making sound plans for economic development programs. Death statistics provide data on the causes of death and measures the magnitude of certain health problems. Maternal and child health programs rely heavily on data relating to infant, childhood and maternal mortality. Vital statistics are important components of the planning and administration of National Health Programs.

In Belize, the Registrar General is the ex-officio registrar of births and deaths under the portfolio of the Attorney General. The *Registration of Births and Deaths Act* requires that whenever a child is born alive, the parent of the child shall within forty-two days after the birth report the particulars to the registrar. The act also requires that on the death of any person a relative of the deceased person shall within four days report the particulars about the death to the registrar.

Section III

HEALTH

The Government of Belize is the main provider of health services. The basic structure for health care delivery is provided by seven government hospitals: one in each of the six districts and one in the Capital City of Belmopan. Presently there has been a growth in the amount of private hospitals operating in the country of Belize. In addition, there are approximately 35 active health centers and over 50 health post throughout the country. Several private clinics exist throughout the country which are operated by religious groups or private physicians.

Service with public health care are carried out by the government of Belize, Private Volunteers Organizations, and Non-governmental Organizations. Outpatient clinics are held at the government hospitals, while rural health nurses conduct a team to provide services by mobile clinics.

There is a shortage of trained staff, especially practical and registered nurses, due to a significant

proportion emigrating to higher paid positions abroad. All doctors are trained abroad and many do not return. As a result, many government physicians are young foreign medical doctors..

The information on health was provided by the National Health Information and Surveillance Unit. The unit has a integrated computerized menu-driven system which was implemented in 1999. It registers, stores, processes and produces information on patient's health, the environment and the health institutions involved.

Health care is defined by the World Health Organization (WHO) as a system of regulations and services created in order to promote health and to prevent and cure diseases. The development of a health care system is related to the social economic situation and technology of the country.

Section IV **EDUCATION**

The Ministry of Education is responsible for managing the National Education System, although with regards to **Primary** and **Secondary** education it shares responsibility with various denomination in a unique partnership. Policy decisions are made by the Ministry with the support of the National Council for Education whose membership is representative of groups concerned with education.

The role of churches in education and their relationship with the government was first formalized in the education Ordinance of 1962.

Information on Pre-school, Primary and Secondary Education, is obtain from the annual **Belize Education Statistical Digest**, which is an official document produced by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports.

Pre-School education level is not compulsory. There has been a rapid growth in the number of schools in the country reflecting a growing awareness of importance of

initiating educational intervention at an early age.

Primary Education: the Ministry of Education has undertaken to translate into reality what is embodied in the constitution and stipulated in the laws of the Country, that basic education be free and compulsory to all Belizean regardless of ethnicity, sex, creed or location.

Secondary Education, furthers the development of general intellectual competencies acquired at primary schools. Secondary school affords those who manage to secure a place, four years of secondary schooling. At this level the curricula provides core subject of study in the first two years and the last two years focus strongly of preparations for the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC).

Tertiary Education is defined as all those programmes offered after completion of secondary education and offering full-time and part-time enrolment.

Section VI **NATIONAL ACCOUNTS**

In this section, data are presented on Gross Domestic Product (**GDP**) and the Gross National Product (**GNP**) & Related Aggregates and **GDP by expenditure**. The GDP and GNP along with the implicit price deflator, are paramount in measuring the growth of an economy.

The **Gross Domestic Product** of an economy is the total value of all goods and services produced by all institutional units resident in the economy within a given period of time, usually one year.

Gross National Product is the most comprehensive measure of the value of income for all final goods and services produced by residents of a country during a specific period of time, usually one year.

GDP @ Current Prices - determines the contribution of individual economic sectors to the GDP.

GDP @ Constant Prices - determines the level of economic growth.

System of Valuation

The following is a list of concepts used for valuating outputs and inputs;

Market Price represents the amount paid by the purchaser, excluding any deductible tax. It includes any transport charges paid separately to take delivery at the required time and place.

Producer's Price is the amount receivable by the producer from the purchaser less any deductible tax. It excludes any transport charges and trade margin separately by the producer. Producer's prices are used extensively to value output.

Factor Cost excludes all taxes on products.

The Central Statistical Office employs variations of the three following main approaches used to estimate the Gross Domestic Product. These are Output or production approach, Income Approach and expenditure Approach.

Section VII

TRADE

The **Foreign Trade Statistics** of Belize are compiled from the Customs documents or declaration forms. Imports statistics cover all goods cleared through customs for home use from abroad and the exports statistics cover all goods of national origin.

Gross Imports - Total value of goods entering a custom's territory, some of which is later sold to a third country.

Retained Imports - Estimate of the value of goods that are imported for use in the local economy.

Domestic Exports - the sale of locally produced goods to the rest of the world.

Re-exports - refers to goods imported from one country and then sold to a third country.

Transshipment - goods purchased by non-residents that enter our port to connect to a third country.

The commodity classification for the imports and exports statistics were previously based on the Standards International Trade Classification (SITC). Then Belize Customs started using a modified version awaiting the implementation of the Harmonized System. The modified commodity classifications is being used in cooperation with the **ASYCUDA** (Automated Systems of Custom Data), a custom administration software program. ASYCUDA has the ability to produce basic statistics and will be an improvement on the accuracy and promptness of the statistics.

As the growing interdependence of states and markets continued to develop, Belize boosted its image particularly amongst neighboring Central American and Caribbean nations. There was a healthy increase in intra-regional trade especially with Caricom. Trade with all other regions noted decreases.

Section VIII

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The **Consumer Price Index (CPI)**, is a measure of the price change in a fixed market basket of goods and services of constant quantity and quality bought, on average by urban consumers. The CPI is used as an economic indicator and for economic decision making. The CPI provides the most widely used measure of inflation.

A **Cost of Living Index**, on the other hand, goes beyond this to take into account environmental and governmental factors which affect a consumer's standard of living.

Inflation refers to a situation which the economy's overall price level is rising. Therefore the inflation rate is the percentage change in the price level from the previous period

The first CPI survey was conducted in 1980 in Belize. The current CPI system is based on a 1990/91 Household and Expenditure Survey, from which the weights, Establishments and Items are obtained. As a result of the survey a total of 277 different items were chosen and prices of these are being

collected nation-wide at the various shopping outlets. These 277 items make up the ***basket of goods*** which a typical Belizean household will consume.

The CPI is conducted in all major urban areas on a quarterly basis. Members from the Central Statistical Office (CSO) are involved in the collection of prices during the months of February, May, August and November of each year.

The main subcategories that make up the basket of goods:

- 1. Food, Beverages and Tobacco,**
- 2. Clothing and Footwear**
- 3. Rent, Water, Fuel and Power**
- 4. Household Goods & Maintenance**
- 5. Medical Care**
- 6. Transportation & Communication**
- 7. Recreation, Education & Culture**
- 8. Personal Care**

Of this eight groups '**Food, Beverages and Tobacco**' is the most heavily weighted group and therefore has the greatest influence on the '**All Item**' rate of inflation.

Section IX

BANKING AND PUBLIC FINANCE

This section presents data on the nations finances and the primary source of this information is the **Central Bank of Belize**.

On January 1982, the Central Bank of Belize replaced the Monetary Authority of Belize. The Central Bank of Belize Act, 1982, defines the main objectives of the Bank as follows: “*Within the context of the economic policy of the Government the Bank shall be guided in all its actions by the objectives of fostering monetary stability especially as regards stability of the exchange rate and promoting credit conditions conductive to the growth of the economy of Belize*”.

In light of these objectives, the bank has the following mission: **“to foster the development of an economic and financial environment in Belize that will facilitate economic growth”**.

The Banks and Financial Institutions Act was enacted in January 1996, followed by the issuance of a subsidiary legislation in the form of Regulations, Notices and Circulars

for the effective implementation. In August 1996, the offshore Banking Act as well as a Money Laundering Act was passed into Law.

Financial players operating within the financial system of Belize consist of the Central Bank of Belize, four Commercial Banks, the Social Security Board, the Development Finance Corporation, Credit Unions and other non-banking sector entities. A huge percent of the financial resources within the financial system are controlled by the four commercial banks. Since 1976, Belize has linked its currency, the Belize Dollar, to that of the United States Dollar in the ratio of 2 BZ\$ = 1 US\$.

Section X

AGRICULTURE

The **Agriculture** sector remains a very important factor in the economy of Belize. The sector is heavily dependent on external trade and is vulnerable to external shocks based on possible changes to the preferential arrangement for the primary agricultural exports: *Sugar, Citrus and bananas.*

Belize has a diverse and complex agricultural production system, ranging from semi-subsistence slash and burn (milpa) through to large commercial concerns. Milpa farming is an agricultural system in which land is cleared and burned, cropped for one or more season and then left in fallow for a period of time. This type of farming is found throughout Belize and is the traditional system used to produce food for home consumption and to supplement income generating activities.

The contribution of **Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing** to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Belize is of significance. In addition, agriculture is a sector that employs a large percentage of the labour force

in the country.

The **Fisheries** sector has performed well over the past years. This great success can be attributed to the expansion in the shrimp aquaculture and the ability of the Belizean fishermen cooperatives. Fish production trend clearly indicated an overall growth and in volume terms farmed shrimp contributes a huge percentage share of the total landings.

The **Forest of Belize** consist of extensive forest and associated woodland resources. A healthy forest can provide outstanding benefits to the economic sector of a given country. The supply of timber products and other construction goods, pharmaceutical goods, energy supply and food supply are among the most important economic benefits provided by the forest.

Section XI

LABOUR FORCE

The Central Statistical Office conducts an annual Labour Force Survey (LFS). The first one was conducted in 1993, and none was done in 2000, since the Census provided information on the labour force. The main objective of this series of surveys is to provide needed inputs into the socio-economic planning process, as well as into decision making at all levels, including management.

The LFS is generally conducted in April, which is the high peak of employment in Belize. However, in 2001 and 2002 the survey was conducted in July and May, respectively. The data collection period is four weeks, while the reference week is mobile, being the week preceding the interview, ‘last week.’ Two different reference weeks were used in 2001 and 2002 i.e. “last week” and ‘the week after Easter.’ Information on the ‘week after Easter’, which was in April, allows for comparison with the previous LFS’.

The sampling frame for the LFS and other surveys is based on the

household listings for the 2000 Census. Prior to 2000, the household listings for the 1991 Census were used as the sampling frame. The household listings are updated on an annual basis. The LFS uses a sample of approximately 5,000 randomly selected households from all districts including urban and rural areas. Previously, (1993-1999) the LFS sample included at least 3,400 households.

The *Labor Force* is comprised of all those persons aged 14 years and over who are engaged in any form of economic activity, for at least one hour, during the reference week or who are willing and able to be engaged in producing economic goods and services. Also included would be all those persons who are temporarily absent from work during the survey week. Hence, the labour force is made up of all those persons who either have a job (*the employed*), or those who do not have a job but are willing and able to work (*the unemployed*).

Section XII

TOURISM & IMMIGRATION

Belize has managed to gain international recognition as a tourist destination. A country with relatively pristine flora and fauna, the longest barrier reef in the western hemisphere and rainforest rich with biological diversity, as well as its cultural history are among the major tourist attractions for the country.

Tourism associated activities are considered among the fastest growing in the economy of Belize. The tourism industry continues to be one of the primary foreign exchange earner in Belize. Tourism is essentially a private sector activity that requires public sector support to be essential.

International tourism incorporates recreational, business and official visitors. The total number of tourist arrivals have shown a slight increase over the years. However, the Cruise Ship passengers arrivals to Belize has shown a positive change in the industries growth. According to the Belize Tourist Board this industry more potential and is expected to increase in the coming years.

Of the three main border points, the Phillip Goldson International Airport (PGIA) remains the main entry point for tourist arrivals. Tourist arrivals in Santa Elena Border Station and Benque Western Border showed a decline.

The Belize Tourist Board describes all accommodations under the generic term 'Hotel', simply as convenient shorthand for all tourist accommodations, including apartments, guest houses, cottages, etc. Hotel occupancy almost doubled between 1990 and 2002, with most of the increase registered in the coastal areas and the Cayo district where a large number of nature reserves and archeological sites are located. In addition, employment in the hotel industry has increased since the demand for more better and excellent services are being required.

Section XIII

PUBLIC ORDER

The Department of Corrections is concerned with the following:

- Reducing overcrowding by constructing new cell blocks
- Improving security by establishing a classification system, implement adequate perimeter lighting, construct additional guard towers etc.
- Establishing a prison farm at the old Listowel Boy's School in the Baking Pot area
- To provide more humane living conditions to the inmates

In addition, the department has an Education and Rehabilitation Programme and its main objective is to plan, supervise and coordinate programmes for inmates in the following areas: Sports, Literacy, Job Training and Alcohol and Drug Abuse Programmes.

The Youth Enhancement Academy (YEA) is under the responsibility of the Department of Corrections. The objective of the YEA are to rehabilitate and educate young and first time offenders in a discipline environment, to offer skill training and to provide training and

development in general education and life skills.

The Police Department is responsible for the following functions:

- General management of police services in accordance with the Police Act
- Control of traffic on all highways and public places
- Provide security services to all members of the public and provision of patrol for the prevention of crimes
- Maintenance of Sub-Stations in all districts
- Supervision of activities of police training, general security and miscellaneous police operations.

Section XIV

ELECTIONS

Mission. The Elections and Boundaries Department is committed to the enhancement of democracy through the promotion of voters education and the maintenance of a legitimate, impartial, valid electoral process.

Its **Goal** is to encourage public participation, forge partnership and to provide efficient and effective service delivery.

The Election and Boundaries Department has three main activities to govern: Electoral Administration, Voters Education and Boundary Redistricting. The electoral administration is the primary function of the department with responsibilities such as organizing and directing the registration of voters, compiling and maintaining electoral registers and supervising and planning elections. In addition, the maintenance of the data base system is another task undertaken by the electoral administration. The data base is important as it forms the lifeblood of our democracy. The voter education program is presently being pursued for the first time.

The primary focus of the department is to provide the tools and support needed by personnel to attain an accurate, transparent database and electoral systems; to forge partnership, share, link, network, reach out to like organizations and stakeholders.

Presently, in the country of Belize, there are twenty-nine electoral divisions. New electoral registration is conducted on a continues basis. Transfer of electors are conducted annually during the months of July and August. Belizean nationals who are at least 18 years old and registered are eligible to vote in the elections. Certain categories of the population e.g. prisoners and insane persons, may not be allowed to vote. General elections are conducted every five years, while Municipal/City Council are held every three years.

Section XV

TRAVEL & TRANSPORTATION

This section provide information on air transportation both passenger and cargo, water cargo transportation, land transportation and traffic accidents.

The Phillip Goldson International Airport is located ten miles from Belize City and is adequate for the country's air traffic needs. In addition, there are smaller airlines that provide services to local municipalities in the country, including some of the off-shore cayes. Information on air traffic is provided by the Civil Aviation Department.

Belize has two main sea port one located in Belize City and the second important port is at Commerce Bight south of Dangriga Town. A third port is located at Big Creek south of Independence (Mango Creek) in the Stann Creek district.

Motor vehicle transportation dominates the movements of people and is a very significant in the freight service. All principal town and villages are linked by road to

Belize and Belmopan City. Regular bus services operate between main towns and larger rural village communities, while secondary and access roads link smaller settlements and production areas. Main highways are limited to two lanes.

Belize have four major highways; the Northern Highway, connecting Belize City with Orange Walk, Corozal, and Chetumal Mexico; the Western Highway connecting Belize City with Belmopan, Santa Elena/San Ignacio, Benque Viejo and Guatemala Border; the Hummingbird Highway linking Belize City with Dangriga; and the Southern Highway linking Stann Creek with Toledo.

Casualties in road traffic accidents continue to rise along with the rapid increase in the number of vehicles. The number of persons killed in traffic accidents occurs mostly in the northern and western highway. In addition, traffic accidents is considered as one of the ten main causes of death in Belize.

Section XVI

CLIMATE

The National Meteorology Service (NMS) is a government department within the Ministry of Public Utilities, Energy , Communication and Transport. The purpose of the NMS is to promote the socio-economic development of Belize through: the provision of warning services to safeguard life and property; secondly, the collection, analysis and dissemination of hydrological and meteorological data and information and thirdly, the provision of advise to the government on matters related to climate, climate change and water resources.

The weather in Belize is often classified by a wet season (June to October) and a dry season (November to May). Two major climatic types recognized in Belize are Tropical and Subtropical. The northern districts and the central part of the country normally experience Tropical weather, while the southern districts experience Sub tropical weather. The Hurricane Season commences on June 1 and runs for six months until November 30.

In general, temperatures in mountains/valleys areas show the dominant monsoon distribution with the months of maximum rainfall (June/July) lagging May, the month of hottest temperatures.

Monthly rainfall totals in most areas peak twice during the rainy season. Peak rainfall activity occur due to tropical and easterly waves crossing Belize from the Caribbean Sea. The Stann Creek and Toledo districts experience a more tropical rain forest climate with high annual rainfall which spread over a greater number of months.

Tropical storms or hurricane activity become most active over Belize when there is another peak in monthly rainfall which occurs in September or October. On average, some ten or more cyclones develop yearly, but just about half reach hurricane intensity.

Section XVII

ENVIRONMENT

The growing concern of Belizeans and the worldwide community at large for environmental quality and sustainability, fostered by the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, 1992 is a message which comes over directly and clearly, from the different surveys and the level of media interest on the environmental field. It was this strong and urgent environmental movement and the Rio commitments by Governments, NGO's policy makers and the public in general that encourage the development of environmental statistics.

The Earth Summit was an unprecedented event. It effectively focused the world's attention on the most critical issues we face as a global community. In addition, it was made plain that we can no longer think of environment and economic and social development as isolated fields.

It is important to mention that the collection, compilation, organization and presentation of environmental information is highly supported by frameworks. However, a framework

defines the scope of the subject to be examined, vital elements involved and the nature of their interactions. In some sense, frameworks act as models that take complex issues in nature and composes on it a degree of order and simplicity. Belize has used a combination of the Resource Sector Framework and the Pressure-State-Response framework, adapting to a situation where some data are unavailable.

The Central Statistical Office included an environmental module in the 1999 labour Force Survey which provided vital information. Based on the previous experience a module was included in the Population and Housing Census, 2000. This type of information is not only vital for environmental statistics but also enhances the policy-making process and the designing of environmental awareness campaigns by targeting specific areas of concern.

The Belizean community is becoming more and more concerned and involved in environmental matters.

Section XVIII **MISCELLANEOUS**

This section provides information from three important sectors in the country of Belize. The Belize Postal Service, National Fire Service and the Belize Social Security Board.

The **Belize Postal Service** operates countrywide under the auspices General Post Office, headquartered in Belize City. Seven District Offices, 4 Sub-offices and 126 Village Post Office constitute the general post office. The main function of the Post Office is the receipt and delivery of mail in a safe professional and expeditious manner.

The **National Fire Service** was established under chapter 108 of the Laws of Belize. The National Fire Service is dedicated to saving lives and property through aggressive fire fighting as well as rescue and extrication service. The department is national in scope with 10 District Branches and a Headquarter located in Belize City, which is the main, Administrative, Training and Operational Center.

The **Belize Social Security Board**,

is a national system of protection or insurance provided by the Belizean society for its members for eventualities of this nature. Employers and workers therefore pool financial resources in order that pecuniary payments can be made to insured persons who would be entitled to benefits covered by the scheme.

The Belize Social Security Scheme's benefits are divided into the following branches: the **Short Term** which includes Sickness and Maternity Benefits, the **Long Term** including Retirement, Invalidity, and Survivors Benefits falls in this category and **Employment Injury**, which covers Employment Injury, Medical Treatment, Prescribed Diseases, Disablement and Death Benefits.

The Mission Statement defines the purpose of the Social Security as "*Social Security will efficiently manage its operations to deliver the best quality service to insured persons, employers and the general public through efficient collection of contributions, prompt payments of benefits and prudent investment of reserve funds*".
