


Percentage of Employed Children and Employment Rates by District, Belize 2013



4.7% (5,188) of Belize's children are employed.

- Corozal has the highest employment rate at 9.1% followed by Orange Walk and Toledo at 5.4% each.
- Belize District has the lowest employment rate at 3%.
- Almost a quarter of employed children live in Cayo and 23% in Corozal.

- The employment rate is highest amongst Mennonites (12.4%) and lowest amongst Creoles (3.3%).
- 44% of employed children are Mestizos, approximately 18% are Creoles and 17% are Mayans.


Distribution of working children:

- Approximately 72% of working children are males and 28% are females.
- About 76% of working children live in rural areas and 24% live in urban areas.

Employment Rate by Sex and Area:

- 6.6% of males and 2.2% of females are employed.
- 6.1% of rural children and about 3% of urban children are working.

Children's Weekly Hours of Work by Activity Status, Belize 2013



- More than a quarter of employed children worked over 45 hours per week.
- About 4% of children were both working and attending school.
- Children who only work are about 10 times as likely to work over 45 hours than those who work and attend school.

- Almost two-thirds of working children are in paid employment.
- Almost one-third of working children are in unpaid employment.
- 43% of 5 13 year olds are in unpaid employment compared to about 31% of 14 17 year olds.
- Males are more likely than females to be working in unpaid employment.
